- 37.** A two-digit number has digits that add to 11. Reversing the digits makes the number 27 larger. What is the number?

- 38.** A father is 30 years older than his child. In 5 years, he will be three times the child's age. How old is the child now?

- 39.** A drawer contains red, blue, and green socks. In darkness, how many socks must you take to guarantee a matching-color pair?

- 40.** A jar contains 5 red, 4 blue, and 3 green marbles. Without looking, how many must you draw to guarantee at least two of the same color?
